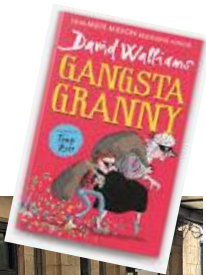

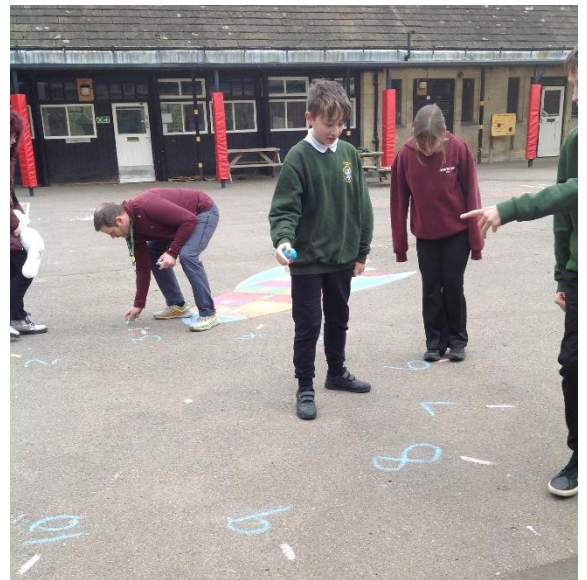

One of our College learners has meticulously built The Tower of Orthanc, from The Lord of the Rings Lego series.

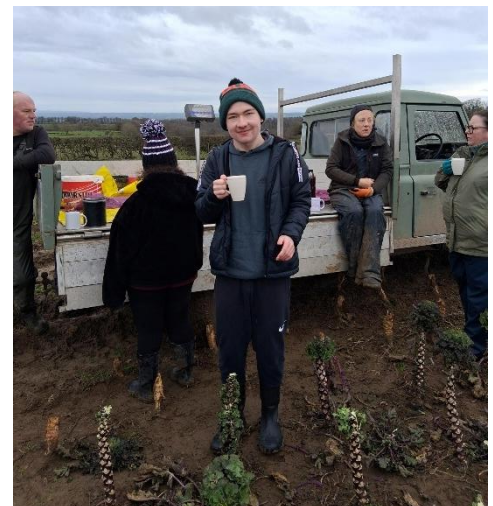
She did it on her own, without any help – what a great job!
