They all enjoyed a sausage roll and cup of tea at breaktime



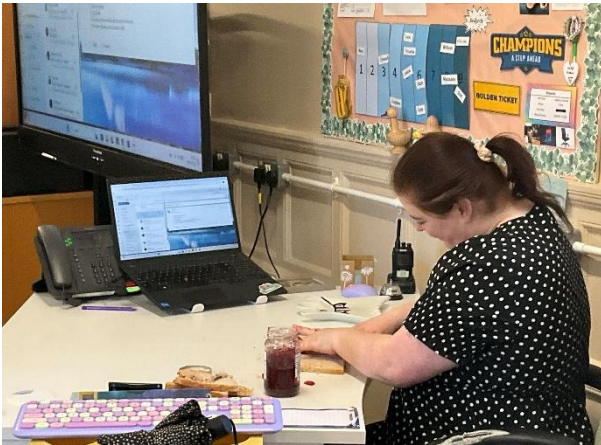

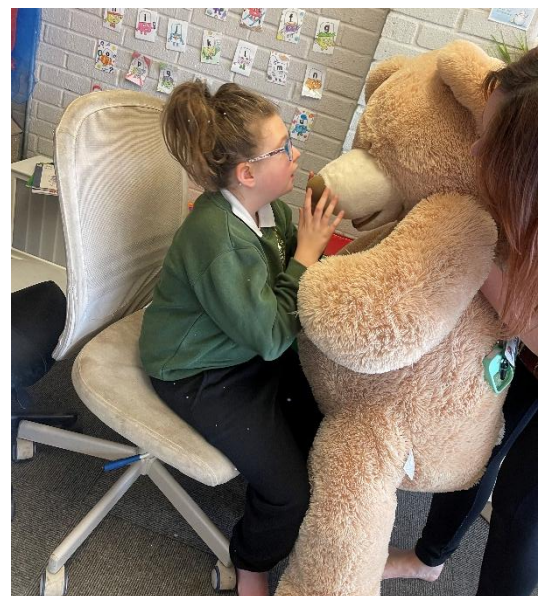

Counter Terrorism Policing's *What You Share Leaves A Trace* campaign is aimed at 13 to 17 year olds at risk of being caught up in terrorist offending. It has been designed in response to increasing numbers of teenage boys being arrested for and convicted of terrorist offences in the UK, often connected to accessing and sharing extremist content on social media.

The campaign centres on two videos. One for younger teens (13 to 15 years old) and another one for older teens (16 to 17). The aim is to educate boys about the risks of extremist content and empower them to make smart decisions for themselves. Both videos focus on the real-world consequences of sharing terrorist content, such as losing their devices, travel restrictions, and long-term impacts on education, jobs and family.

The campaign is running on TikTok and YouTube and we have been asked by our local authority to make parents are carers aware of it, in order to start the conversation with your young person.
