

The Cherry Garden curriculum is designed to meet the needs of pupils through a personalised approach; each learner's progress is tracked through daily observations and end of term assessments by expert teachers. It focusses on the early communication, social and emotional and cognitive skills that are the foundation of learning. It is a curriculum that recognises the importance of movement and play in a child's development and the need for sensory and multi-sensory approaches to learning.

We use a multi-sensory approach and through repetition of personalised activities and experiences such as morning routines, TacPac, sensory stories, rebound therapy and personalised sensory diets. Essentially what we teach them is shaped by them, their interests, their engagement and responses when learning and what skills they need to become as independent and engaged within their community as possible, therefore we cannot give an overview of themes and topics as we never know where the learners will lead us next. Below you can see the areas of our learning, how these are broken down for holistic development, some of the activities each learner will be part of across the year and approaches we use.
