

Introducing Iverson Trust

Iverson Trust (formerly Pace) is a national charity that has been providing specialist support for those affected by child exploitation in England and Wales for 25 years.

They provide a range of support services for parents and a full training programme for professionals. They aim to keep children safe from exploitation by helping their parents, disrupting the exploiters and working in partnership with police and family services.

Working with parents and carers

Their parent support workers provide independent, non-judgmental and confidential support.

They can talk through a parent/carer's immediate concerns to assess the level of danger your child may be in, and signpost parents to agencies in your area who may be able to provide local support.

They also equip parents with information for notifying police and social care, and provide practical tips for logging information and gathering evidence. They do not apportion blame and aim to help parents find the best solution for your family.
